# 本課教學目標:

- 1) 瞭解全球化、全球化狀況與全球主義在政治、文化、經濟與環境四層面的意義與爭論點;
- 2) 討論電影與新聞所呈現的全球化實例,並藉此瞭解周遭世界;
- 3) 思考全球化風潮中的自身處境,並學習積極地放眼世界、在地實踐。

**Objectives:** this course is designed for students to

- 1) Understand what globalization, globality and globalism mean economically, politically, culturally and ecologically;
- 2) engage in critical discussion of cases of globalization as represented in current news and films:
- 3) reflect on issues of globalization and their own positions so as to think globally and act locally.

### **Description:**

What is globalization? How has it developed and influenced us? How do we think globally, while trying to act locally? Despite the current rise of protectionism, globalization and its impacts are here to stay, as it has formed a vast network system we live in, however amorphous and ambivalent this system is. It is thus important for us, as global citizens, to be globally aware by understanding its impacts, and globally engaged by looking into its critical issues and reflecting on how to position and contribute ourselves.

This course introduces the basic definitions of globalization and their related controversies, discusses the economic aspects of globalization in terms of its advantages and disadvantages, as well as the roles of the British Empire and the USA. We then engage students, via feature films, in understanding various concrete cases of globalization and how they reveal a mixture of political, economic, cultural and ecological aspects of globalization. Through the use of these features films and inclass activities such as News Square and roundtable discussion, students will learn to not only understand and connect with the world around them, but also think critically about their own positions.

#### Global Issues Teach & Learn Workstation

### Objectives:

To teach a global issue with a concrete example (news event, film or story), through a sequence of workstations in order to engage your "students" (3 groups) in discussing it with interest.

### 目標:

對象 Target: Your "students": 3 other groups in the class

時間 Time: 3 Sessions in one period; Each Teaching Session: 15 mins (see the table below)

教學模式 Format: To best interest and engage your student groups, the workstation should have at least [not necessarily in this order]:

- 1. A warm-up session 開場 (2 mins): to evoke students' pre-knowledge
- 2. PowerPoint station 生動介紹(3 mins): to explain the chosen global issue
- 3. **Media station** 影音、演出或遊戲(3 mins): show your example of the issue (Media can be a short film, but it can also another media such as flash cards or a [jigsaw] puzzle.)

- 4. **Discussion station** 討論 (4 mins): to activate their background knowledge and presumptions
- 5. Assessment station 知識回饋 (3 mins): test your students' knowledge
